Opening the Church Doors for the National RE Celebration in March 2011

Redbridge SACRE has won a NATRE bursary to encourage more schools to visit their local churches. The bursary focuses on the use of Labyrinths and reflective exercises in learning about and from Easter in Key Stage 2.

Assessing Pupils' Progress in Religious Education.



Making assessment meaningful and manageable continues to be a challenge for teachers of foundation subjects and RE. In secondary schools QCDA's exemplification of standards project has helped teachers to standardise work at each level.

The new government decided that the APP project would not be published but the level criteria may be helpful for those looking for a different outlook on what characteristics to look for when recording levels of progress.

Religious Education in the English Baccalaureate

News from the Department of Education in December that Religious Studies GCSE would not be included in the Humanities section of the English Baccalaureate caused much concern in Redbridge Schools.

SACRE discussed the matter at its December meeting and Chair Ian Morris wrote to the Secretary of State to add voices in Redbridge to those calling for this

decision to be reconsidered.

The Secretary of State; Michael Gove has acknowledged that many people believe that RS should be included. In his evidence to the Education Committee he also stated that he did not want to prejudge the outcome of the debate.

If you have a view on this matter, I would urge you to write to the Secretary of State yourself.

We hope that an announcement will soon be made to remedy this situation especially at a time when many schools are preparing for Year 9 options choices.
